At last a little splash for **The Storytime Penguin!**

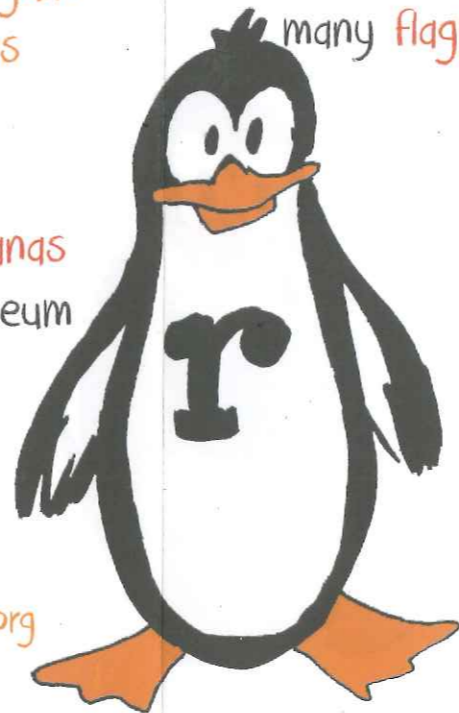
9. How many pinky-orange pillars face the Hilton Hotel at the **Albert Dock**?

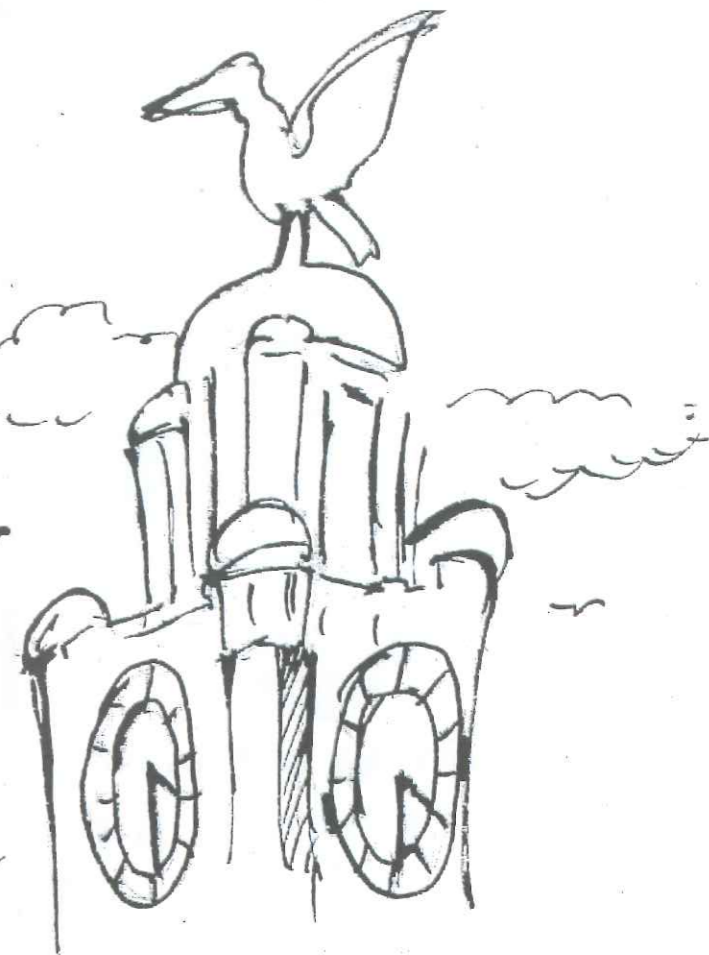
12. On the red-and-white striped building at 30 James Street, home of the **Titanic**, how many windows are there on the floor immediately below the three balconies?

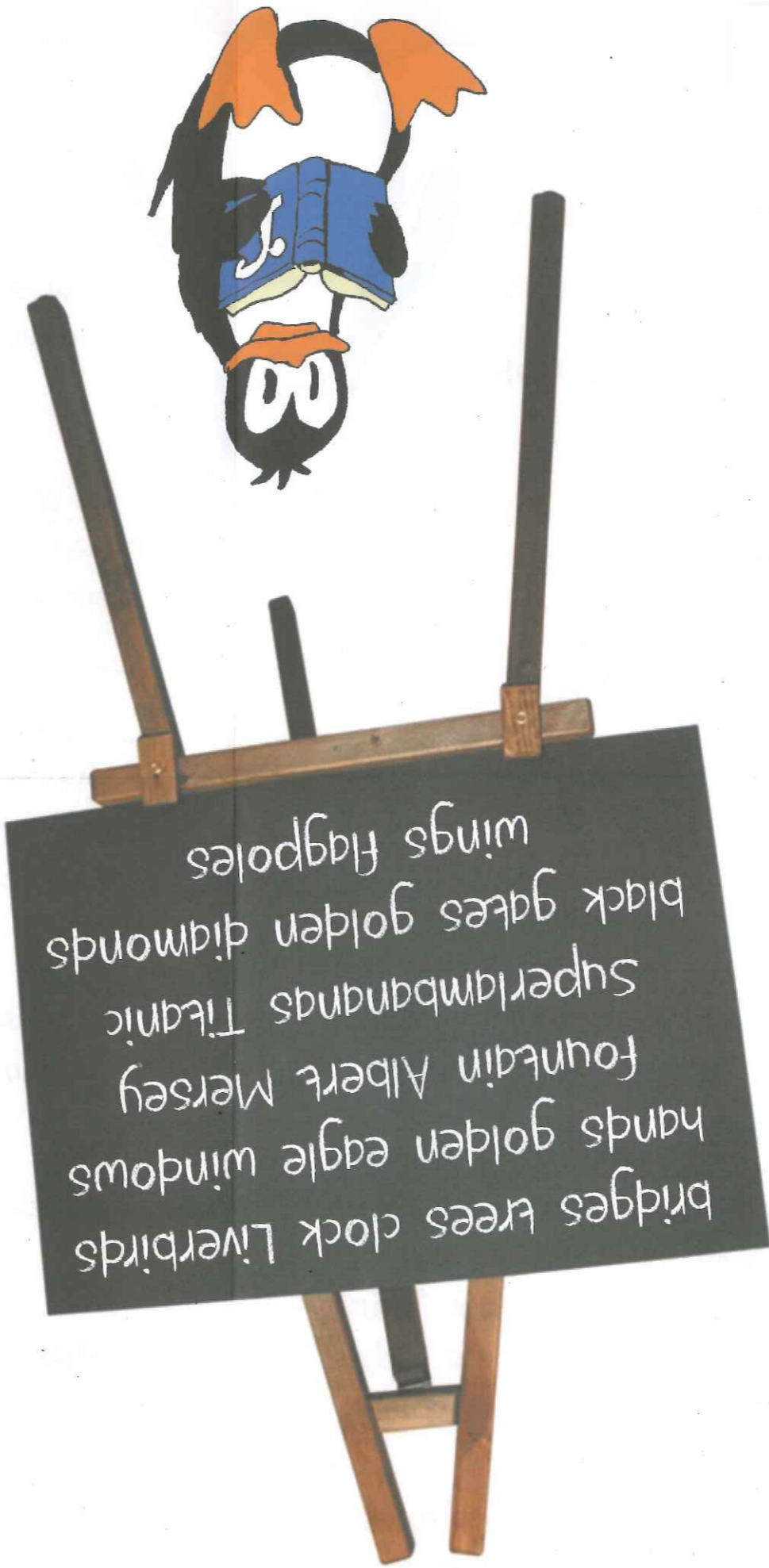
